

DEC·O·RA·TION

Decoration may refer to:

- The decorative arts: arts or crafts concerned with the design and manufacture of *beautiful objects* that are also functional.
- It includes interior design, but not usually architecture.
- The decorative arts are often categorized in opposition to the "fine arts", namely, painting, drawing, photography, and large-scale sculpture, which generally have no function other than to be seen.



DECORATIVE "ARTS"





- An object or act intended to increase beauty of a person, room, etc.




WHAT IS BEAUTY?

- Beauty is a characteristic of a *person, animal, place, object, or idea* that provides a perceptual experience of pleasure or satisfaction.
- Beauty is studied as part of aesthetics, sociology, social psychology, and culture.
- An "*ideal beauty*" is an entity which is admired, or possesses features widely attributed to beauty in a particular culture, for perfection.
- *The experience of "beauty"* often involves an interpretation of some entity as being in balance and harmony with nature, which may lead to feelings of attraction and emotional well-being. Because this can be a *subjective experience*, it is often said that "beauty is in the eye of the beholder."
- There is evidence that perceptions of beauty are evolutionarily determined, that things, aspects of people and landscapes considered beautiful are typically found in situations likely to give enhanced survival of the perceiving human's genes.

AESTHETICS

- Aesthetics: is a branch of philosophy dealing with the nature of art, beauty, and taste, with the creation and appreciation of beauty.
- There is such variety in the field of Aesthetics: program includes; Hairstyling, Skin Care, Nail Technology, Make-up Artistry, Facial Treatments, Body Treatments (Wraps & Scrubs), Electrolysis, Ear piercing, ect...

Decoration may also refer to:


- Christmas decoration, decorations used at Christmas time

DECORATION IN COMPUTERS

- Name decoration, a technique used in most programming languages
- Window decoration, in computing are the window's visual elements drawn by a window manager
- In graphical user interfaces, the window decoration is a part of a window in most windowing systems.
- A USB decoration is a decorative device that uses the Universal Serial Bus (USB) connector for electrical power, and sometimes the protocol, on a computer or other host.
